
Kenneth R. Israel Major General, USAF Retired

He was awarded the Theodore Von Karman Award for Science & Engineering, the DIA's Director Award and the National Reconnaissance Office Director's Award. Ken is also the 2011 Recipient of the Association of Old Crows (AOC) Gold Medal Award. Ken was recently elected to the AOC Board of Directors beginning in 2013.

Ken holds a Bachelor's Degree in Chemistry from Baylor University and a Masters Degree in Systems Management from the University of Arkansas.
